Consent Agenda – Form and Purpose

- What is a Consent Agenda?
 - Consent agenda groups routine, procedural, informational and self-explanatory non-controversial items in an agenda
 - Items presented to the board in a single motion for an up or down vote
- Great! But what does this mean?
 - Documentation for consent items provided in advance, BoD vote reflects due diligence and fulfillment of responsibility
 - Board members ask questions for clarification prior to the meeting
 - If item(s) on consent agenda require discussion to support action or a decision item is removed from the consent agenda and raised later in the meeting
 - Any board member can request that an item be moved to the full agenda
 - Vote on the single motion applies to all the items on the consent portion of the agenda.
 - Document acceptance of consent agenda

Example of Consent Agenda Items

- Approval of board and committee minutes
- Correspondence requiring no action
- Committee and staff reports
- Updates or background reports provided for informational purposes only
- Appointments requiring board confirmation
- Approval of contracts that fall within the organization's policy guidelines
- Final approval of proposals that have been thoroughly discussed previously, where the board is comfortable with the implications
- Confirmation of pro forma items or actions that need no discussion but are required by the bylaws
- Dates of future meetings

Budget and Finance

- Each year IRIS is required to have an A-133 Audit performed by an external audit firm.
 - The audit tests financial statement presentation, internal controls and compliance with award requirements.
 - The results are reported to the Board and submitted to our funding agencies.
- Each year, IRIS is required to submit to NSF a proposed structure and maximum provisional rates for ICR (Indirect Cost Recovery).
 - This includes a G&A (general and administrative, applicable to all programs) and overhead rates for the DC and Seattle offices.

G&A FY15 25% FY14 25% base = Total IRIS modified direct costs
DC OH FY15 36% FY14 37% base = HQ salaries
Seattle OH FY15 19% FY14 20% base = DMC salaries

- Each year IRIS is required to submit Form 990 to the IRS
 - Form 990 is the primary public source of information on tax-exempt organizations.
 - It includes general information on the organization and overall financial status
 - An overview of the purpose and content of Form 990 will be provided during the Board training in May.

Annual Membership Meeting Venue

- The Yank Sing Restaurant, which has been the venue for the Annual Membership Meeting for many years, is no longer catering to meeting events.
- The San Francisco City Club (155 Sansome Street) provides excellent meeting and catering facilities. Total costs are similar to the Yank Sing and significantly less than at AGU hotels.
 - The location is closer to AGU facilities and Union Square than the Yank Sing.

Informational item

EarthScope Ten Year Celebration

- IRIS is collaborating with UNAVCO and the EarthScope National Office to hold a celebration of EarthScope's first decade.
- The event will be held in the AAAS building on May 15 (at the end of the IRIS Board meeting)
- Program
 - Science Symposium Thursday afternoon AAAS auditorium
 - Reception and Exhibit following the Symposium AAAS Atrium
 - Meeting at NSF and Congress may be arranged in conjunction with the Celebration
- The IRIS Board had previously agreed to provide un-restricted funds to pay for the reception (cost sharing with UNAVCO and ESNO).

ID/IQ

- IRIS has adopted a new procurement arrangement to enable competition for items where we anticipate placing multiple orders over a period of time.
- Under this procedure, called ID/IQ (Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity), vendors are invited to submit proposals for meeting requested specifications. Proposals address their ability to meet the specifications as well as quality, delivery and warranty provisions.
- Proposals are reviewed by a selection committee. Vendors that are selected are qualified to submit final price and delivery bids on which IRIS will award purchase orders.
- This procedure has now been used to qualify Quanterra and Nanometrics from among 4 bidders for supply of posthole seismometers. It is also being used to qualify vendors to supply vault seismometers for PASSCAL and GSN.
- This type of procurement may be used for power and communications systems in the future.

- At the November Board meeting, the Board responded to issues raised by SC's and coordinated by CoCom
- Responses were distributed to CoCom on November 26

Status Update

 - Under development. Funds(~\$15-20K) from old CA to be used to provide participant support
- 3. EPO requests guidance on pursuing industry funding
 - **Encouraged.** Procedures being developed to facilitate acceptance of private funds
- 4. ISM seeks endorsement for EarthScope Decade celebration
 - Underway. Use of unrestricted funds approved

 - Follow-up meeting in Houston being planned. Field deployment in TX being planned
 - BoD to consider further activities at Denver meeting
 - "New Technologies" review now available on BOD website

 - Session on Ocean seismology on the agenda for the Denver BoD meeting
 - GSN SC meeting at Lamont in March Oceans to be agenda topic
 - MariScope meeting held during AGU
 - 7. ISM requests guidance whether GABBA should be kept alive
 - 8. ISM requests guidance whether SZO should be kept alive
 - Well-attended SZO meeting held during AGU
 - Plans underway for SZO discussion at IASPEI, Bogota in July
 - 9. TA requests that the BoD provide a 5 year budget assumption to be used in planning the CEUSN project
 - Update on CEUSN funding expected from NSF at Denver BoD meeting

 - 11. PASC requests clarification on role of PASC in providing Polar guidance
 - Clarified that PASC is responsible for oversight of Polar activities.
 - PASC membership has Polar representation
 - 12. PASC requests that "PASSCAL" be maintained as program name with "Program for Array..." being replaced by "Portable Arrays..."
 - Agreed
 - 13. PASC requests that BoD weigh in with unresolved issues regarding merger of FA and PA
 - Included in discussion with Working Group on PASSCAL Sustainability in Denver
 - 14. PASC requests that PASSCAL have right of first refusal for any lower 48 TA instrumentation
 - Awaiting accounting and timeline of instrument availability from IS
 - 15. PASC encourages IRIS to approach NSF about establishing a mechanism for more rapidly approving and distributing funding for future RAMP capability and deployments
 - Awaiting discussion of topic at the March PASC meeting

- Status Update continued
 - 16. CoCom Recommendation: The BoD should maintain a strong line of communication with IRIS staff and the Consortium as the new governance changes are implemented
 - Final discussion of Governance revision concerning IS structure is on the Denver agenda.
 - Following the Denver meeting an update will be posted on the IRIS webpage.
 - 17. CoCom Recommendation: The BoD should consider changing the timing of selection of new chairs to enable overlap and smoother transition
 - Agreed This should be considered by Committees expecting a transition in Chair at their Spring meeting and recommendations (including name and transition schedule) provided to the Board.

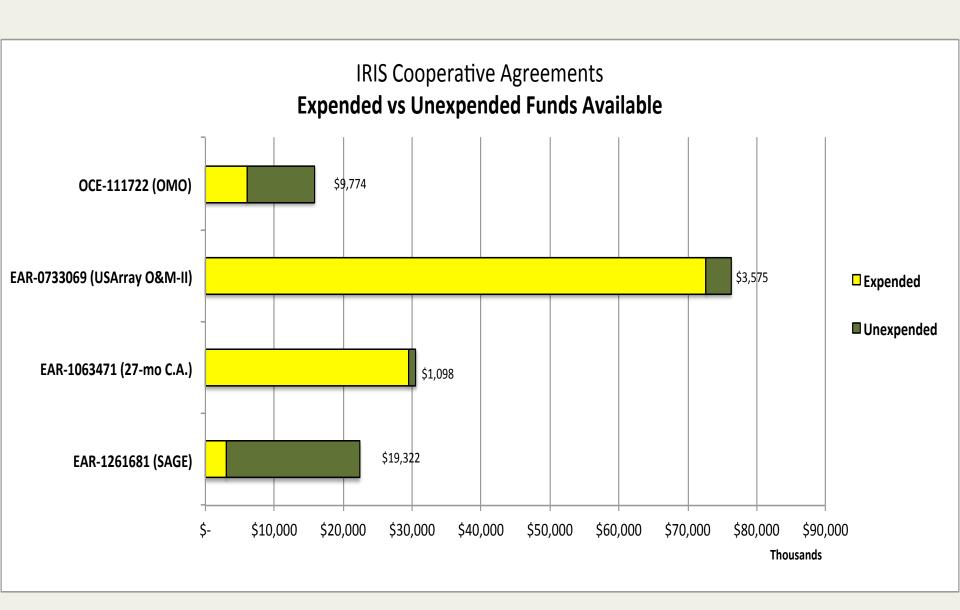

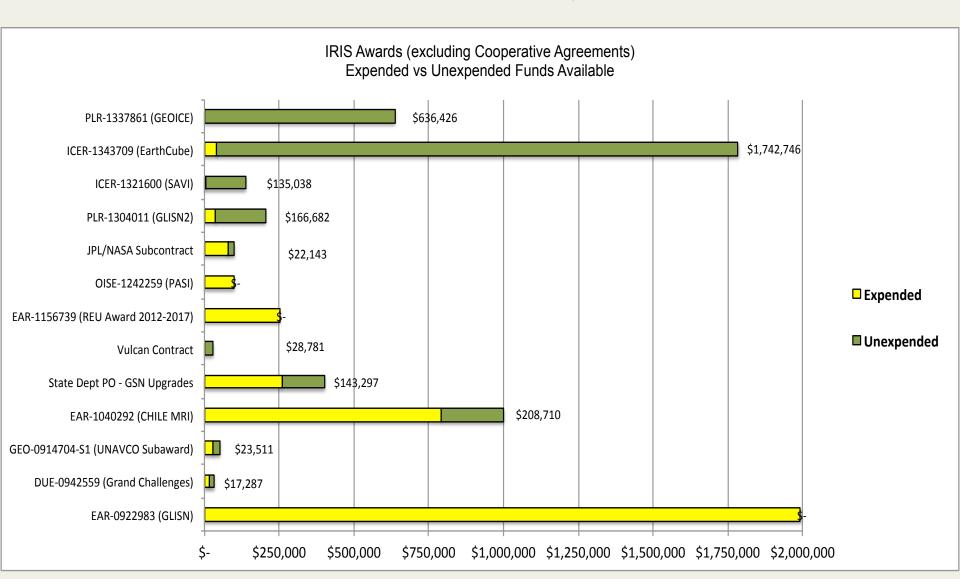

Funding StatusAward Balances Remaining as of 12/31/13

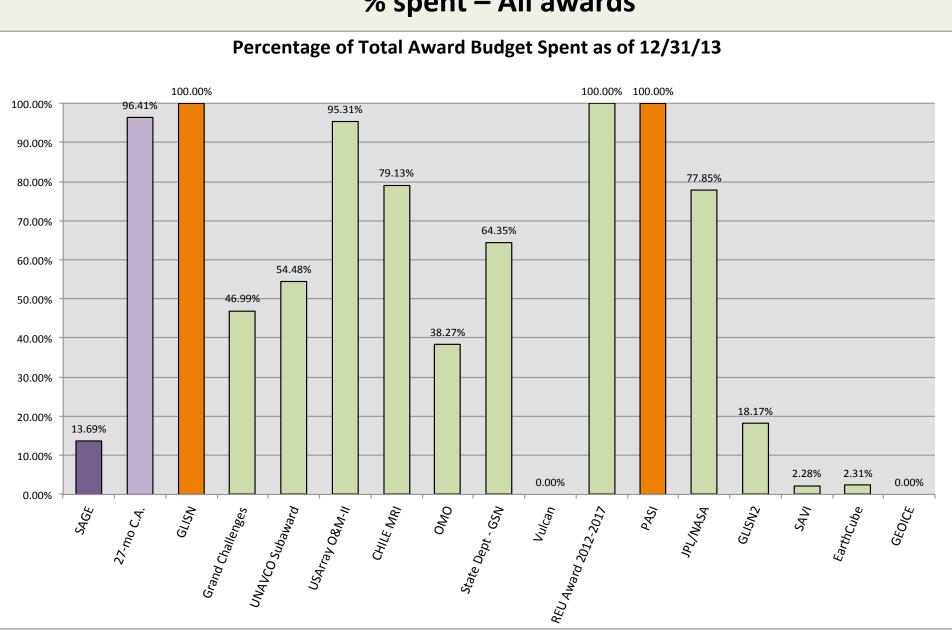


Funding StatusAward Balances Remaining as of 12/31/13

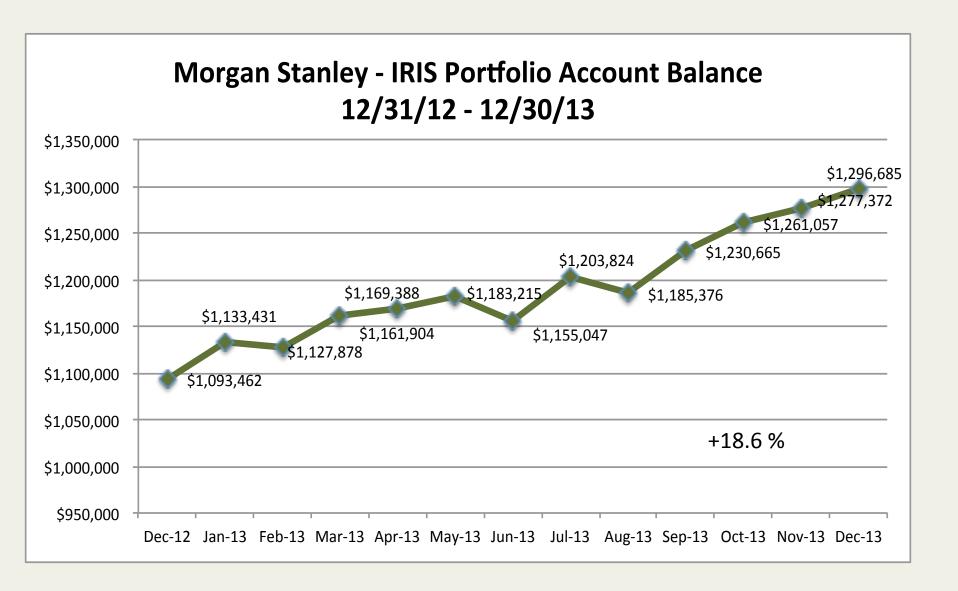

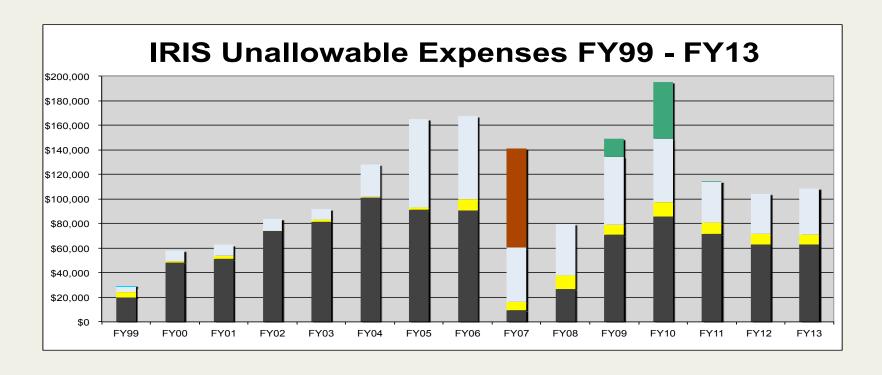

Investment Fund Account

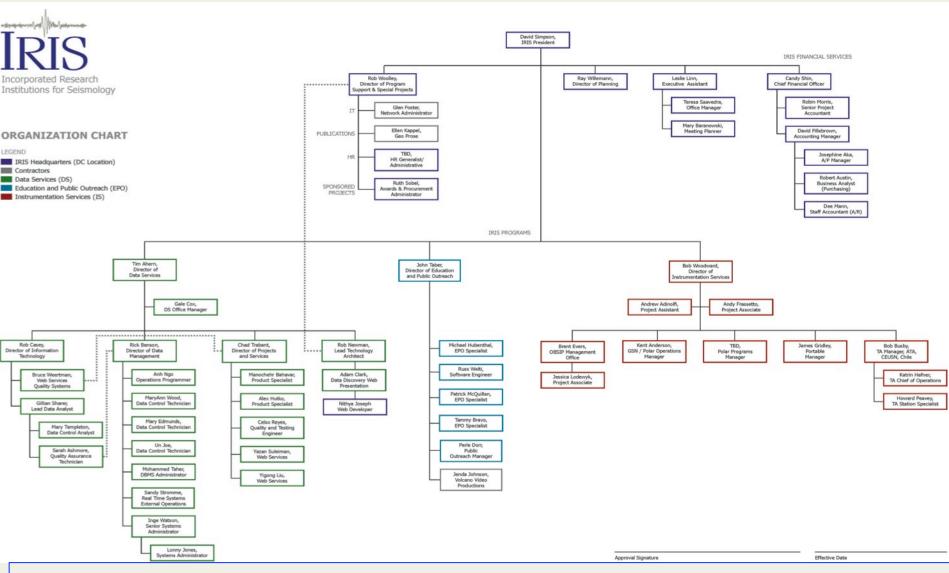


Unrestricted Funds
